Ranking Report

Vote Counts: Based on voter rankings of the candidates, the BigPulse voting system's algorithm automatically conducted rounds of calculations called counts. In each count, any candidate who received the quota of votes required (total number of votes divided by the number of available seats plus 1), was confirmed as elected. Any votes received by a successful candidate in excess of the quota were redistributed to other candidates according to the voter's next ranked choice. If no candidate reached the quota in a given count, the candidate with the fewest votes was excluded and their votes redistributed to the remaining candidates proportionally based on each voter's next ranked candidate choice. Candidates were elected either by reaching the quota of votes or until only enough candidates were remaining to fill the available seats.
