RE: Ontario's 2025/26 RSV Prevention Program

Dear Healthcare Provider,

This letter is to provide you with an update on the RSV prevention program for infants, high-risk children and older adults.

Older Adult RSV Prevention Program

The 2025/26 older adult RSV prevention program that was initiated last fall will continue throughout the spring and summer (i.e. year-round) for [eligible individuals](#). The RSV vaccine has demonstrated multi-year protection and is authorized as a single dose (i.e., no boosters). Therefore, the vaccine can be administered outside the RSV season.

RSV vaccine doses should continue to be ordered through your usual supply chain (i.e., how you order RSV and other vaccines).

Infants and High-Risk Children Prevention Program

The 2025/26 maternal, infant, and high-risk children RSV prevention program will come to an end for the season on **April 17, 2026**.


Doses of the monoclonal antibody (Beyfortus) and the maternal vaccine (Abrysvo) should no longer be administered to infants, children, or pregnant women after this date.

All remaining non-expired inventory held at healthcare premises should be stored under appropriate cold chain for use during the next RSV season.

If maternal, infant or high-risk doses are required after **April 17, 2026**, for exceptional use (i.e. if the RSV season is considered active and on-going in your local area), please contact your local public health unit.

Thank you for your continued efforts in ensuring Ontarians are protected from vaccine preventable diseases.
